ACCEPTING CHILD PROTECTION DATA COURTS GRANT

WHEREAS, Kane County on behalf of the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit, Kane County, in collaboration with the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts agree to participate in the implementation of the Child Protection Data Courts project; and

WHEREAS, the Child Protection Data Courts project was created as part of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 which provides a portion of federal funds to state court systems to conduct assessments of their foster care and adoption laws and judicial processes, and to develop and implement a plan for system improvement; and

WHEREAS, the Kane County Judiciary has been notified by the Administrative Office of the Illinois Courts that one hundred percent of the cost of the project, \$4,625.00 (Four Thousand Six Hundred Twenty Five Dollars) will pass through Kane County and are to be disbursed to the appropriate vendors conducting the study; and

WHEREAS, the budget amounts need to be reflected in revenue and expense General Ledger accounts; and

WHEREAS, receipt of said grant will require an amendment to the Judiciary Department Fiscal Year 2013 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Kane County Board that the Chairman thereof and hereby is authorized to accept the Child Protection Data Courts grant and authorize the necessary expenditures to implement the project. The Judiciary Department 2013 budget is to be amended as follows:

COLLABORATION OF LOCAL CHILD PROTECTION COURTROOM STAKEHOLDERS

For several years, the child protection stakeholders have collaborated in many ways. Quarterly meetings are held, which typically see very good attendance including the assigned judge, prosecution and defense counsel, CASA, private agency workers and supervisors, DCFS counsel, and DCFS workers and supervisors. Prior to the meetings, attendees are invited to place items on the agenda. Typical areas of discussion are courtroom management (i.e., scheduling, timeliness of reports, etc.), ongoing training, and changes in policy. There is also a training committee from among our stakeholders who have organized special training sessions relevant to child protection practice. Past trainings have included a review of the criminal justice system, trauma-based practice, maximizing the use of DCFS clinical resources, and how the subsidy unit works. Future trainings in the planning stages include education and special education as those issues relate to child protection, testifying in court, and the needs of and services for older youth. These informal training sessions are held approximately bi-monthly over the lunch hour, and are also very well-attended by our stakeholders.

CPDC PROJECT CAPACITY

Lisa Buss has accepted the positions of site coordinator and data coder. Lisa is a volunteer with CASA and brings valuable experience to the position. At this time, additional staff is not anticipated.

Supervisors from the Circuit Clerk's office sat in on our original planning meetings and have been kept abreast of our progress. The Circuit Clerk's office has expressed a willingness to assist the data coder in accessing closed JA court files to conduct data collection through a court file review process.

A designated area within the Old Courthouse has been identified for the data coder to code cases. This location will help maintain confidentiality of files.

Joseph Onzick, Executive Director of Finance, will act as the fiscal agent for the CPDC Project in Kane County.
