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Kane Can Do Five: New toolkit supports breastfeeding

A new toolkit for Health Providers is now available to help encourage breastfeeding supportive strategies.

The Kane County Breastfeeding Coalition, with its mission to support and promote breastfeeding in Kane County, has designed the *Kane Can Do Five Breastfeeding Toolkit for Primary Care Providers*. This Tool Kit will assist primary care providers in implementing policies and protocols recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), The American Congress of Obstetricians & Gynecologists (ACOG) and many other health provider professional organizations to assure that breastfeeding is promoted and supported as the best nutrition for babies.

The Coalition encourages primary care practices to start by implementing just five of the 12 AAP recommendations—whichever are the easiest. Once the first five are "live" in the practice, the next five will be that much easier to implement. Taking small, realistic steps is vital to success.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and prevention, breastfeeding protects babies from infections and illnesses that include diarrhea, ear infections, and pneumonia. Breastfed babies are also less likely to develop asthma, and those who are breastfed for six months are less likely to become obese, one of the threats to community health and well being identified in the Kane County Community Health Improvement Plan. Mothers themselves who breastfeed have a decreased risk of breast and ovarian cancers. The toolkit can be found at www.candofive.org
