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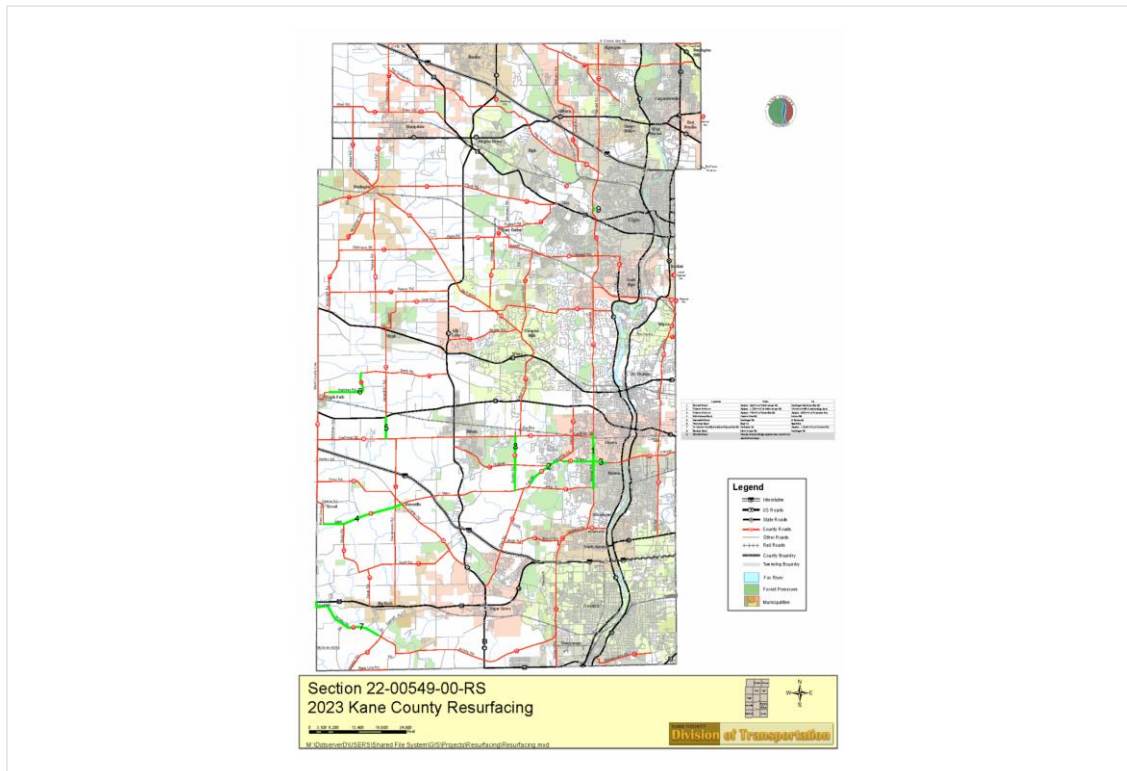
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### 2023 Kane County Resurfacing Program

April 17, 2023 - Motorists are advised to be alert starting the week of Monday, April 24<sup>th</sup> as pavement removal and replacement on portions of various County Roads is scheduled to begin, weather permitting. Construction work hours will be from 7:00 am until 5:00 pm Monday thru Saturday. While the roads will remain open during this work, temporary daily lane closures and/or flaggers will be required to control traffic. The resurfacing process is part of our annual maintenance to increase the longevity of County roads. The program will consist of milling and resurfacing, structure adjustments, curb and gutter replacement, and sidewalk removal. Milling of rumble strips on Meredith Road at the Keslinger Road intersection, full depth patching at the Claude Hanson Bridge on Randall Road south of Big Timber Road, and the application of pavement markings are also included. This contract has an expected duration of approximately six (6) months to complete, weather permitting. Listed below are the portions of roads to be resurfaced. The list does not necessarily indicate the sequence of work.

- Randall Road – 300' south of Main Street Road to Keslinger Road
- Fabyan Parkway – 1,235' northeast of Main Street Road to the Mill Creek bridge
- Fabyan Parkway – 475' east of Kaneville Road to 875' west of Western Avenue
- Main Street Road – County Line Road to Harter Road
- Meredith Road – Keslinger Road to IL 38
- Thatcher Road – Root Lane to Beith Road

- Jericho Road/Hinckley Road/West County Line Road – US 30 to 1,200' northwest of Granart Road
- Bunker Road – Main Street Road to Keslinger Road
- Randall Road – Claude Hanson Bridge approaches south of Big Timber Road
- Randall Road – Sidewalk improvements at entrances between IL 38 and Oak Street
