"We wanted to find a way to officially remember Harold, and thought a brand new Forest Preserve District picnic shelter, within Aurora — the city he served for many years — would be a fitting tribute," said Forest Preserve Executive Director Monica Meyers. "Harold always had a big smile for everyone he met, and he had a huge heart. Our staff misses him every day," she said.

The Aurora Police Department Pipes and Drums will play at the ceremony. Carter was a bagpiper with the group, and also played bagpipes at various Forest Preserve District grand openings. Fr. Jerome Leake, head chaplain with the Aurora Police Department will offer a benediction. Forest Preserve Sergeant William Glisson will also provide remarks about his longtime friend and coworker.
